2ND ENTRYWAY SIGN

In 2013, the Old North End Neighborhood Board approved funding for a second Old North End entryway sign at N. Nevada Ave. and Lilac St. The first entryway sign is currently in place at N. Nevada Ave. and Uintah St.

The City Parks and Recreation Board, one of several City entities that must grant permission, approved the second entryway sign project in the fall of 2013.

The second entryway sign is currently awaiting the completion of the N. Nevada Ave. bridge over the old Rock Island railroad tracks project. Once landscaping of the bridge is completed, the City will issue a building permit for the second entryway sign.

The second entryway is similar to the sign at N. Nevada and Unitah St. with a couple of differences. It will be constructed using battered columns which are wider at the bottom, and it will use the two remaining grates from the Stearman House, formerly located on the Penrose Hospital campus.

Thank you to ONEN's past president, Vic Appugliese, and to Pat Doyle, Bob Loevy, and the entire Historic Preservation

Committee for all the hard work required to plan and execute this great neighborhood project.

The Old North End was the ideal venue to bring this popular holiday event back to life. Thanks to the legacy of the Colorado Springs Symphony Guild and Salvation Army Holiday Home Tours, people from around the community were eager to visit the Old North End once again, and

enjoy a diverse selection of neighborhood homes, decked out in their holiday best.

Genuine winter weather in early December put snow on the ground, cloaking the entire neighborhood in winter wonderland magic. Anchored by CC's landmark Stewart House, the tour visited homes on Wood Avenue, Tejon Street, and Monroe Street.

TwoCor, under the direction of longtime ONEN neighbor Jim Hinkle, can now better serve atrisk youth in El Paso County with programs that combine work ethic development, job skills training, and trauma-informed care. "ONEN friends brought us the tour idea, numerous volunteers, and many tour patrons. I'm hopeful that people involved with the tour now know more about TwoCor's work – we are honored to be the tour beneficiary." As an expression of thanks to the neighborhood, TwoCor staff

and clients constructed a Little Library, to be installed near Steele School. TwoCor will also work on long-needed improvements to the median flowerbeds at the intersection of Wahsatch and Uintah. 🌣

A Tradition Begins

A Call to the Past

In 1977, Donna Guthrie, Liz Bevington, and Vicky Kipp, young mothers of children at Steele Elementary School and friends of Old North End neighbors, joined hands to organize ONEN's first Fourth of July Parade. It was the brainchild of Donna Guthrie, who had read about such an event elsewhere. To Vicky Kipp, it would be reminiscent of July 4th celebrations enjoyed at her aunt's and uncle's home outside Columbus, Ohio.

Before social media, communication to the entire neighborhood was difficult. Invitations had to be typed and printed. Red card stock was used and each card was decorated with a U. S. flag sticker. Pertinent information on the cards indicated the date, time, and location, and it was requested that families bring cookies to share. Children were encouraged to decorate and ride their wagons, bikes, or scooters in the parade.

Hand-delivered Invitations


The completed invitations were laboriously hand-delivered to every home in the Old North End. At the time, Dan Kipp, CFO of the holding company for McDonald's local stores, arranged for McDonald's to donate orange drink and balloons. Tables were set up at the top of Boddington Field on Wood Avenue. Neighbors gathered and celebrated.

The parade route began at the corner of Boddington Field and Wood Avenue, continued


south along Wood, west on Del Norte Street, north on on Alamo Avenue, and then back to the park. An intergenerational crowd, some colorfully dressed, lined the streets along the route. Many held flags and greeted friends. General Rocky Crawford sat on his front porch on Wood Avenue, attired in red, white, and blue, waving more than one U.S. flag.

Postcard-perfect Day

Picture the day as sunny, clouds painting the sky with thin, wispy strokes. Pikes Peak and the Rockies are beautifully perched in the background. The parade has ended and parents, neighbors and children form a line before a length of tables laden with a variety of homemade cookies. Colorful balloons dot open spaces between the table and a line of dark green firs beyond. There are sounds of laughter, the hum of conversations, and the energy of playful children. With this, a wonderful North End tradition began.

Just a few years after it began, Cate Boddington and her friends took charge of organizing the parade and placing the signs used today in strategic places around the neighborhood.

In a few years, the baton was passed to Cate Boddington and her friends, who continued to laboriously Xerox and cut the invitations and pass them out door to door. Fortunately, by then, signs that advertised the event were put up in strategic locations throughout the neighborhood.

Join the tradition this July 4th as Tim Boddington raises his trumpet to announce the start of the parade with a "Call to the Post." ❖

ONEN will pay 50% of the cost of repairing a maximum of 50 feet of city sidewalk, which does not need to be continuous.

Keep in mind that sidewalk shaving is an excellent alternative when the sidewalk panels are in good condition, but a trip hazard exists. A demonstration panel is located at 1422 North Tejon.




